




Fairfield Bucks Tally

HUNTINGTON, WEST VIRGINIA | FAIRFIELD INNOVATION PLAN

The **Draft Plan Community Open House** was held on Thursday, September 19th, 2019. The meeting reviewed the Fairfield Innovation Plan to the community to approximately 60 residents and stakeholders in attendance. Each resident received \$10,000 in 'Fairfield Bucks' to prioritize or 'fund' their favorite of the 12 Priority Projects featured in the First Draft of the Fairfield Innovation Plan (published August 27, 2019).

The graph below illustrates which projects received the most funding from resident attendees. **"Bring a full-service grocery store to the former Northcott Court site to serve as a community anchor,"** received the most 'Fairfield Bucks,' followed by "Renovation and Expansion of AD Lewis" and "Creation of life skills classes for youth." These top-ranked projects will receive further concept development within the final draft of the Fairfield Innovation Plan.



TOP THREE MOST "FUNDED" PRIORITY PROJECTS

Funds	Project
\$112K	Bring a full-service grocery store to the former Northcott Court site to serve as a community anchor.
\$80K	Support the A.D. Lewis Community Center to include more youth programs, playgrounds, services, and activities through renovation and expansion.
\$63K	Create more opportunities for youth to develop critical life skills such as cooking, personal finance, and coping with emotions.
